

# Tashkent Commercial Energy Storage Project

What is EBRD doing with Tashkent solar PV & energy storage?

Nandita Parshad, Managing Director, Sustainable Infrastructure Group at EBRD, said: "We are proud to partner with ACWA Power and co-financiers on the pioneering Tashkent Solar PV and energy storage project in Uzbekistan, the largest of its kind in Central Asia. The project is core to Uzbekistan's ambition to install 25GW of renewables by 2030.

Will Uzbekistan have a battery energy storage system?

ADB said it will be one of the first utility-scale renewable energy projects with a battery energy storage system (BESS) component in Uzbekistan. It follows the announcement of the country's first BESS in May 2024 and the connection of the first phase of a 511 MW solar project in March of this year.

What's going on with the Tashkent Riverside Project in Uzbekistan?

From pv magazine ESS News site Saudi-listed ACWA Power has announced the completion of the dry financial close for the \$533 million Tashkent Riverside project in Uzbekistan, near the country's capital city of Tashkent. The greenfield development will involve a 200 MW solar plant and a 500 MWh BESS that will serve to stabilize the Uzbek grid.

Will Uzbekistan fund a 250-megawatt solar photovoltaic plant?

TASHKENT, May 21, 2024 -- The World Bank Group, Abu Dhabi Future Energy Company PJSC (Masdar), and the Government of Uzbekistan have signed a financial package to fund a 250-megawatt (MW) solar photovoltaic plant with a 63-MW battery energy storage system (BESS).

Will ACWA Power build a 500 MW solar plant in Uzbekistan?

ACWA Power plans to build a 500 MW solar plant and a 500 MWh battery energy storage system in Uzbekistan under a project proposed by the Asian Development Bank (ADB). The ADB is proposing a large scale, solar-plus-battery system in Uzbekistan.

What's happening in Tashkent in 2024?

It follows the announcement of the country's first BESS in May 2024 and the connection of the first phase of a 511 MW solar project in March of this year. Separately, ACWA Power recently announced financial close on a 200 MW solar plant and 500 MWh BESS near the national capital, Tashkent.
