

What percentage of Serbia's electricity comes from coal?

Serbia's national power utility Electric Power of Serbia (EPS) produces nearly 70 percent from the country's electricity from coal and nearly 27% percent from hydropower, with approximately 4% coming from private developers in wind and solar energy. Serbia heavily subsidizes coal and electricity prices, inhibiting competition.

Who owns the electricity market in Serbia?

The electricity market in Serbia is dominated by the state-owned power utility EPS(Elektroprivreda Srbije - Power Industry of Serbia), which owns all large generation capacities and supplies most consumers. Fossil fuel production Serbia's coal reserves are mainly located in two main coal basins, Kolubara and Kostolac.

How much power does Serbia have?

It currently has a total capacity of approximately 3490 megawatts(MW) of renewables, with 2342 MW in hydropower in 2019 according to the European Energy Community. Serbia announced plans to install new hydropower plants and two existing dams, and to rehabilitate a further 15 existing power plants totaling around 30 MW with EBRD financing.

What percentage of electricity is generated by wind power in Serbia?

Despite strong growth in wind power in recent years,in 2022 it still made up only three per centof electricity generated. The electricity market in Serbia is dominated by the state-owned power utility EPS (Elektroprivreda Srbije - Power Industry of Serbia), which owns all large generation capacities and supplies most consumers.

Where can wind energy be found in Serbia?

The greatest potential of wind energy in Serbia is in the area of the powerful "kosava" winds such as South Banat and East Serbia, as well as on the eastern side of Kopaonik Mountain, Zlatibor, Pester, and mountain passes at altitudes above 800m; as well as in the valleys of the Danube, Sava and Morava.

What is Serbia's energy investment plan?
